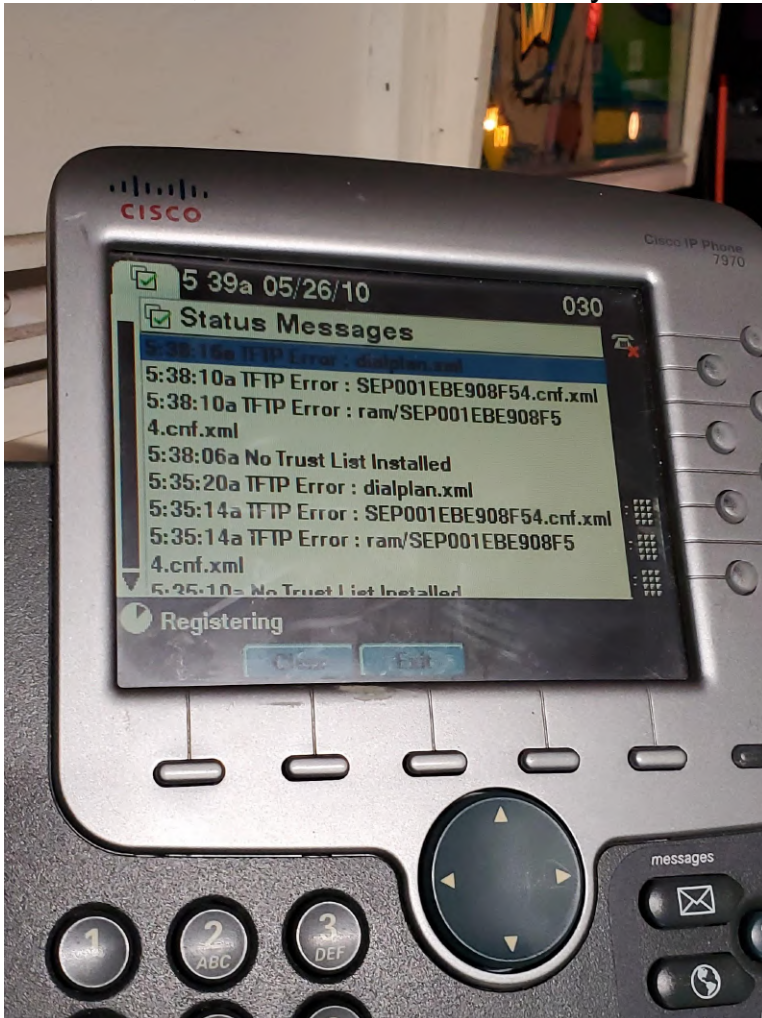
Originally this lift was built in the 60s by *Gotthilf Bauer* but somewhere in the 2000s it had been modernized by Kone with *TMS50e*. Despite it having a blind Omron VF it runs fairly nice also these lifts are a bit grotty and particularly one of them, was very noisy (but I liked it)... and now its in the process of being modernized. The swing doors are replaced with automatic doors, new hoisting machine, logic (NewLift) and button panels.



< Here you see the boring new lift motor (*Liftequip TW45*)

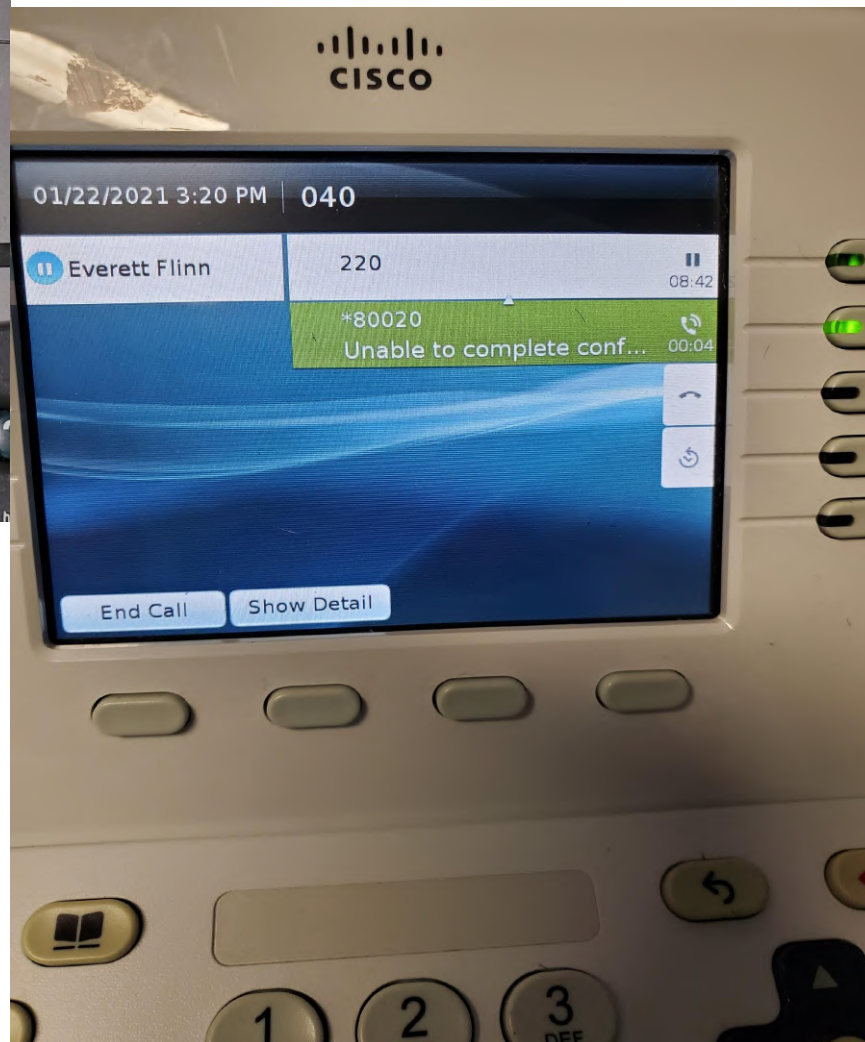

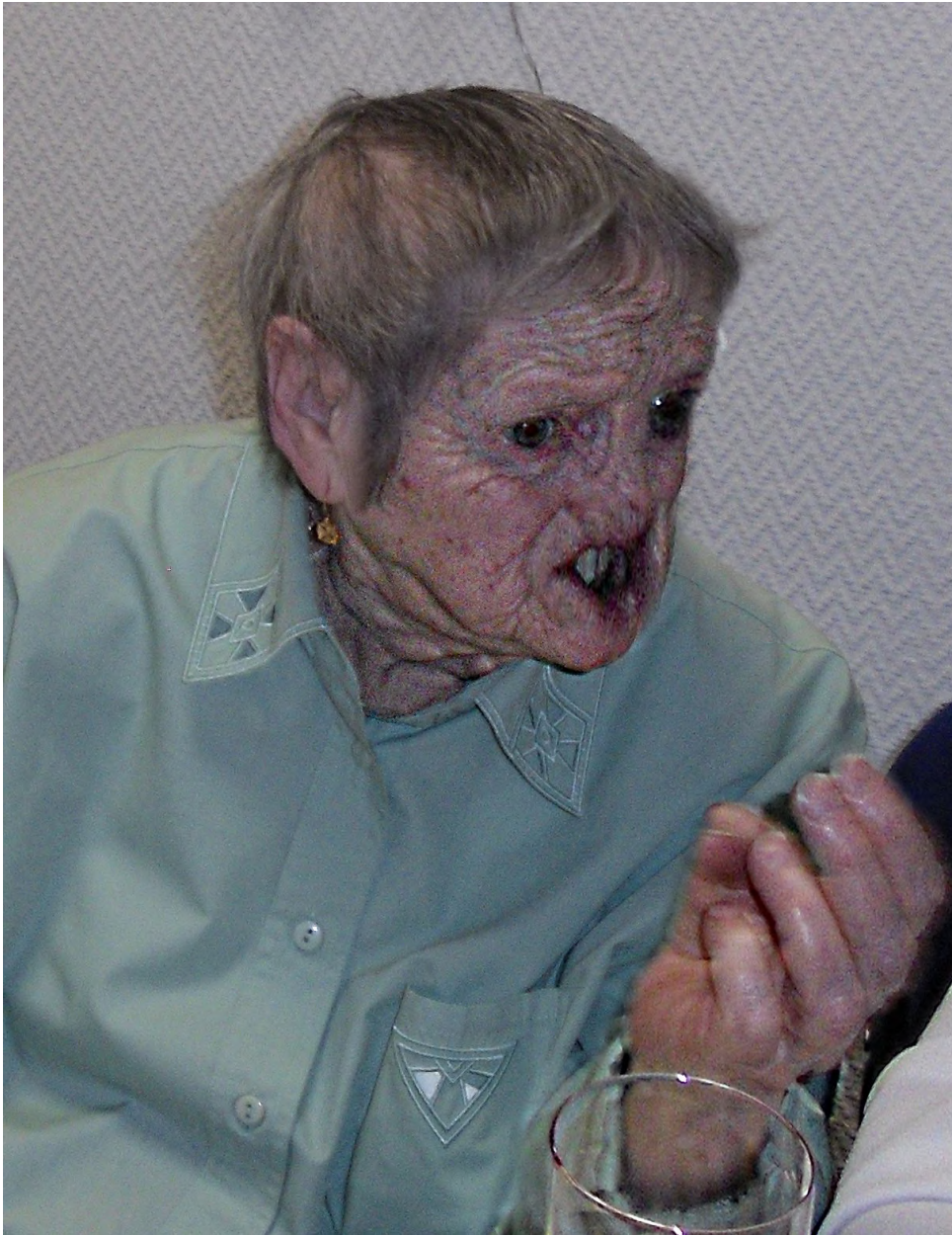


WESTINGHOUSE MODERNIZED BY GENERIC WITH MAGNETEK VF AND FUTARA LOGIC

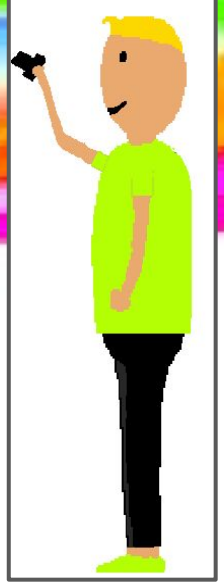

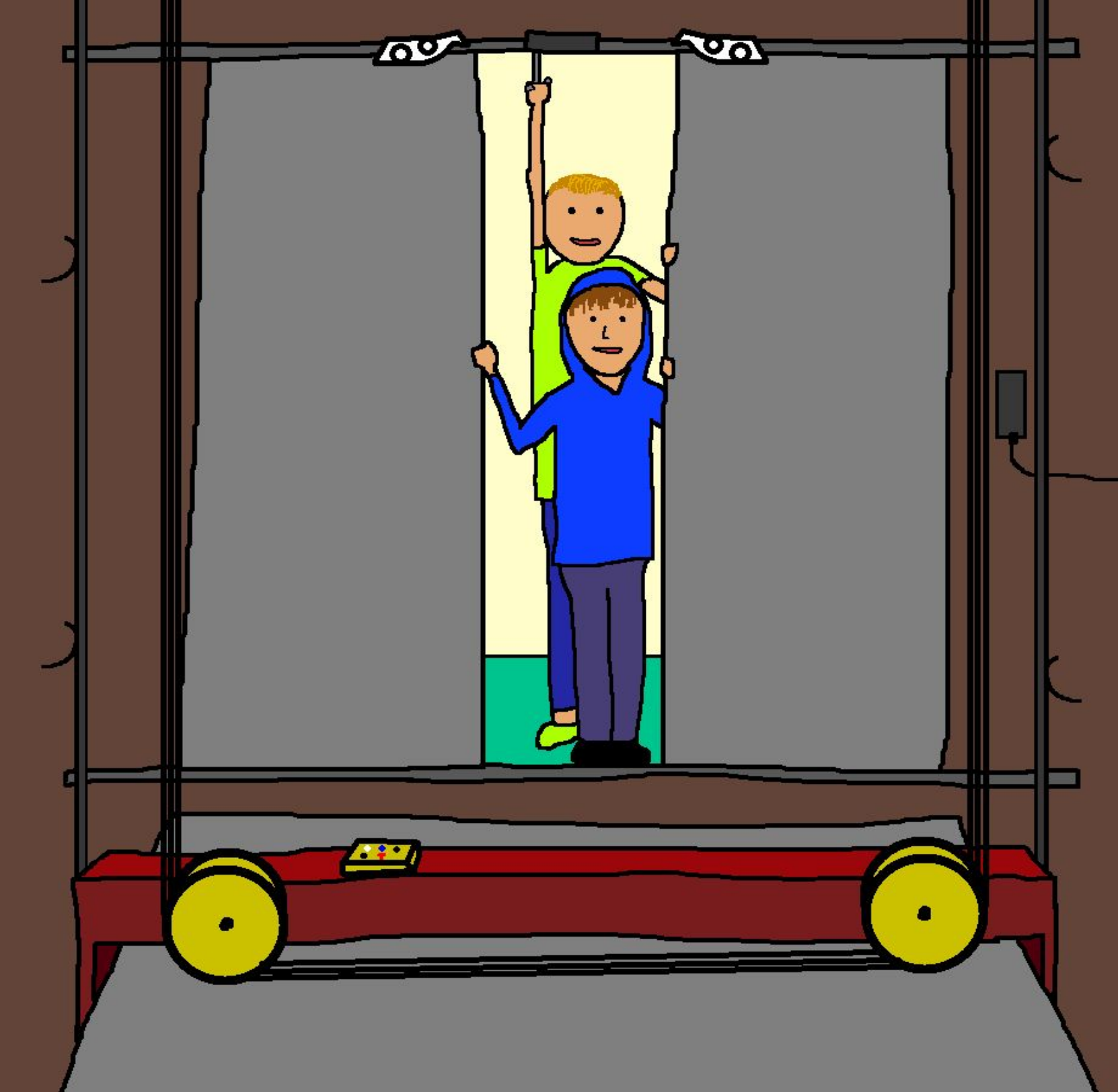
